It's still a mystery how Sarah & I (among 4,000 evangelists from around the world) were invited to attend *Amsterdam 83* in July 1983. 75% of the evangelists were from 3rd world countries. To my knowledge, the only evangelists we personally

knew were George Brunk and Myron Augsburger. It was our first introduction to Ravi Zacharias, Bill Bright, Nancy Leigh

DeMoss, E. V. Hill, and of course, Billy Graham and his team. We came to know Reverend Graham, not only as an evangelist to crowds of thousands, but also for joining all of us in street evangelism campaigns around the city of Amsterdam, Holland. He donned a baseball cap which disguised him as a "common" soul winner.

The defining moment of the 10-day conference came during Reverend E. V. Hill's closing message, "Will you surrender"... and go wherever God leads you? The Holy Spirit squeezed our hearts until liquid filled our eves. Sarah and I said yes to God's calling to abandon our lives to Him and trust Him with the consequences. Exactly one year later, God gave birth to Gospel Express Ministries and the mystery continues.

The opportunities God gave Billy to preach to many millions and counsel and influence presidents and world leaders was only possible by the grace and mercy of Almighty God. The greatest attribute and source of his effectiveness was God's holy anointing that produced spirit-filled preaching. The organizations long standing legacy of integrity can be traced to a resolution drawn up in 1948 during evangelistic meetings in Modesto, CA. 

Grady Wilson resolved to uphold the highest standards of Biblical morality and financial integrity. These principles were taught at *Amsterdam* '83 and the Assoc. Schools of Evangelism. They not only impacted my life, but also thousands of pastors, evangelists, ministries, and parachurch organizations through the years.

Billy was an ambassador against racial injustice and segregation. He said, "There is no Scriptural basis for segregation. The ground is level at the foot of the cross." At a crusade in Chattanooga, TN in 1953, he

went into the auditorium one evening ahead of the crowd and personally took down the ropes that divided the crowd by skin color. From then on Billy Graham Crusades were fully integrated. "Then Peter opened his mouth, and said, Of a truth I perceive that God is no respecter of persons." Acts 10:34

A Gallop poll estimated that 35 million Americans heard Billy Graham preach in person. From the onset in 1947 there were 400 crusades in 53 countries, plus an additional 185 countries and territories reached via satellite meet-




2018 Bible Read-A-Thon BIBLES FOR AFRICA **PRAISE REPORT**

A huge thank you to all the children and sponsors. The hunger for the printed Word is enormous in third world countries. During the January seminar in Uganda, we gave seven Bibles each to 50 bishops/pastors and then gave one Bible each to the additional 250 attendees. You cannot imagine how desperate they were to receive their very own Bible in their language.

Over 100 children have read approximately 161,000 pages. 245 sponsors





have contributed over \$35,000 which will all be invested directly into the printed Word...PTL! The top three readers combined have raised \$9,531.

The cost for each Bible ranges from \$4-9 depending on the language. This Read-A-Thon should enable us to purchase approximately 5800 Bibles! Please pray with us for wisdom as we give Bibles to church leaders, villagers, refugees, and prisoners throughout the continent of Africa.

Working behind the scenes is our network of Bible study test graders, without which this program could not function. For many inmates this is the only contact they have with the "free world."


A big thank you from Gospel Express to all our graders! Only eternity will reveal the fruit from your unselfish, un-applauded ministry. God bless you for your labor of love.



Reaching out in our prisons is very hard, because you must take them provisions such as toothpaste, bar soap, face towels, lotion, and sanitary towels for women.

We never imagined that we needed to know so much about our marriage relationship, not only as a couple, but also as parents. Through this seminar, we understand the enormous responsibilities that each of us has to each other and to our children along with establishing
