# Servant Leadership

First, I give honor and glory to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It is by His grace alone that we live and move and have our being. Proverbs 20:24 says "Man's goings are of the Lord; how can a man understand his own way." God continues to do exceedingly abundantly above

what we could even ask or think...to Him be all the Glory. My heart is gripped with mixed emotions, amidst a world of suffering, sorrow, fear, and hunger. Through it all, Jesus is speaking, and I believe He is saying to all of us, "Come

unto Me."

The following is a summary of the official Executive Director transitioning that took place in Sarasota, Florida, on February 21st. The lunch and ceremony included our ministry staff, Executive Board, four of our daughters/sons-in-law, and a sprinkling of "significant others", including my 94-year-old dad, Marvin Beachy, and John Schmid. My first vivid memory of my dad was at age four when he carried my polio ridden/partially paralyzed body into the local hospital. Now he's carried me in his heart through all these years of ministry...an unexplainable blessing!

During that Friday meeting, I was asking us to try and wrap our minds around the tremendous impact of obeying the

the Holy Spirit.

It's unimaginable the far-reaching implications when Marvin Beachy obeyed God's prompting and made that phone call to Sarah and I in January of 1974.

And then after 10 years of pouring life and purpose into our family, Marvin and the Gospel Echoes Board of Directors blessed our family to fulfill the evangelistic calling He had placed on our lives.

Marvin was experiencing something that both of us have become familiar with throughout the years. When those around us obey the call to "greater works" they will pay a price and so will those around them.

Checking files, I see that the first newsletter article I wrote in August 1984 was titled "Heeding the Call." The first 16 years of this ministry consisted primarily of singing and evangelistic ministry with our family, Duane Mullett, and the support of our office staff and Board

of Directors. The ministry began to extend its reach with Freedom Hills in 1988, followed by North Florida Chaplaincy Program (known as GEMS - Gospel Express Ministries South), Door of Hope, Living Hope International, Gospel Express Canada and Texas, and From Pain to Purpose, from 1990-2015. The international ministry began to unfold in Kenya, Ghana, and Uganda, Africa in 1997 and 1998. In 1999, the Dave Miller Family joined the ministry.

Sharing about these avenues of ministry at the Florida meeting, I kept referring to the significance of the phone call Marvin made in 1974 and the decision that led to the formation of

Gospel Express in 1984. 2000-2001 was a difficult time for our family as "on the road" traveling and singing had come to an end. There were valleys of humiliation to walk through

where I wondered, "God what are you saying?" What we didn't realize was that God was beginning a new chapter of ministry both stateside and international.

The one-family ministry branched into

numerous families: families with musical talents and spiritual giftings. The families and office staff all belonged



to God, but He expected us to train, to equip, and to empower them to fulfill their God-given purposes. Now I came face to face with the biblical concept of leadership, "GIVE UP TO MOVE OTH-ERS UP." We prayed for them, and also released and blessed them when the time came. Genuine friendships were developed, whether they served here or elsewhere. In addition to the Miller's and the Mullett's, this included Ron Yoder's, Paul Mark Miller's, Steve Stutzman's, Amos Raber's, Sean Bontrager's, Jake Penner's, and the Mel Stoltzfus Family.

Following the Proverbs 11:14 principle, we formed a Co-Director team in 2002 with Duane Mullett, Dave Miller, and myself. Lonnie Raber and Mervin Wengerd were added later. It's a team effort that processes vision and daily ministry activities while providing a safety net. We established three core mission principles: evangelism, discipleship, and compassion. My role also changed then from Director to Executive Director.

Approximately 3 years ago, Sarah and I, along with Duane & Cindy Mullett and our Executive Board began the dialogue

of transitioning the Executive Director role. With a unified spirit, we asked Dave and Ruth Ann to consider filling this position. We are indeed grateful to God that they have humbly accepted this responsibility. God has blessed Brother

Dave with servant leadership qualities and teambuilding skills that I believe will enhance the overall ministry at Gospel Ex-

press, and beyond. Most importantly is the evidence of God's anointing upon his life and his family. As Christian leaders we have been called by Jesus to fulfill a most unorthodox method of leadership, "He that is greatest among you shall be your servant," Matthew 23:11. It's an upside-down Kingdom where he that is greatest becomes a servant of all. The servant ministry of Jesus in John 13 has deeply impacted my life. That is why I chose to present a towel to Dave as a symbol of serving others. The words of Jesus on the towel, "I have chosen you, and ordained you, that you should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain," (John 15:16).

Are Sarah and I retiring? © This is a word we have not heard from the Lord or the Board! We are so grateful for the support of our Board and co-workers. We have their utmost blessing to continue to develop areas of ministry wherein God has given me passion and vision for, honoring the fruit-bearing principle of Psalm 92:12-15 as long as God enables. In January, Nelson and I were privileged to be part of a team that traveled to Uganda, Africa. For the next ten days, our eleven-member team worked alongside the Ugandan medical staff and local pastors to accomplish our mission of doing medical clinics in remote villages, ministry in prisons, hospitals, and churches, along with humanitarian outreaches.



The medical clinics were. for me, the most heartbreaking. We did clinics in three different villages and each one had lots of people and lots of sicknesses. We would treat between five and seven hundred people at each clinic and there were still many more that did not get medicine.

This region is close to the equator, very warm and humid, and as each day wore on, it was apparent

that there was no clean water available. We would take extra cases of bottled water along to hand out but there was never enough. It was hard to see some of the little children crying and it really impressed on all of us the dire need for clean water. Parasites, malaria, and malnutrition are very common and access to clean water would drastically reduce these illnesses and greatly improve the lives of these remote villagers.

Between clinics, we were privileged to be part of a four-hour Sunday church service in a small village. It was inspiring to see our brothers and sisters in Christ worship and to hear what God is doing in rural Africa. After the service, we were treated to a delicious local meal. We were all reminded that happiness and contentment do not depend on one's circumstances but on a relationship with our Savior!

Another highlight was prison ministry. Nelson has a good relationship with the Commissioner of Prisons in Uganda and through that, we were able to minister in four different prisons. It is not common for groups to go into prison, so most inmates were very receptive and open to hearing the Gospel. In Uganda, if a woman is incarcerated and has a child, it is common for the child/ mother to be together in prison. It was really heartbreaking to see these little ones inside barbed wire fences. The warden is pleading with us to build a daycare outside of the women's prison to provide care and education for these children.

The trip was a very moving experience. I'll never look at life the same. My sincere appreciation to everyone that was part of the team, from North America and Uganda. May God continue His work in and through us.



#### A Gift from God - 2008 Prevost Bus

I hardly know how to begin this story, so I will start with some verses that have become so real in this process. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts. - Isaiah 55:8-9

How long do you keep pouring funds into an old bus? We have been driving a 1992 Prevost, formerly used by the New Creation team, with likely close to



two million miles. We can't know exactly because the odometer isn't accurate. The engine has had several rebuilds. The bus would still serve a purpose for a group that doesn't use it as heavily.

After the Executive Board approved (without borrowing money) moving ahead in the search for a new bus, we prayed, "Lord show us where the right bus is and where the funds will come from." Here's where my tears start: a 45 minute one-on-one meeting resulted in a generous contribution and then later led to this proposal: "I will offer to raise all the needed funds." What do you say to an offer like that? A HUGE THANK YOU is such an understatement. A 2008 Prevost bus was found, with a suitable interior layout and very little renovations needed. Because of the miles (713,000) on the original drive train, another individual offered to pay for a new engine and transmission... Glory to God! The purchase price was negotiated and the person God raised up to do the fundraising approved everything and went to work.

The fundraising was largely done through personal contact and very little had to be mentioned at public functions or on social media. Normally this would be a long and arduous procedure, ranging from eight months to a year, but it all took place in approximately 60 days! Currently, the bus is here and ready to go! We have marveled and wept tears of joy repeatedly. "My ways are not your ways...."

Then, as if all of this wasn't enough, the first of the year I was contacted by an individual who offered to pay for all the fuel in the Miller bus for 2020!! Because of the coronavirus, we can't travel right now, but we are trying to stay patient.


